Removing Linguistic Barriers

Importance of a Knowledgeable Deaf Researcher

Ongoing Partnerships

"Don't just seek feedback once—build lasting relationships."

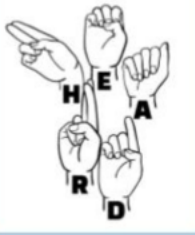
