




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
NIHR GHR Programme portfolio





NIHR INVOLVE

Guidance on co-producing a research project

- Sharing of power the research is jointly owned and people work together to achieve a joint understanding
- Building and maintaining relationships
- Respecting and valuing the knowledge of everyone involved in the research
- Including all perspectives and skills
- Reciprocity, everybody benefits from working together



Minimum Quality Standards and Indicators for Community Engagement

- Participation (involvement)
- Empowerment and ownership
- Inclusion ("no one is left behind")
- Bi-directional communication
- Adaptability and localisation
- Building on local capacity
